Les versions françaises des résumés peuvent être plus détaillées au besoin.

- Toutes les soumissions seront laissées à l'appréciation du Comité Scientifique et les auteurs se verront notifier la réponse au plus tard le **15 Juin 2013**.
- Bien qu'un auteur puisse soumettre plusieurs propositions, chaque premier auteur ne se verra attribuer qu'une seule communication : soit orale, soit affichée. Merci de préciser votre préférence.
- Les auteurs doivent prendre en considération l'aspect éthique de leur travail avec l'animal. Le comité scientifique pourra être amené à demander plus de précisions si nécessaire.
- Les résumés des propositions acceptées seront disponibles en version papier.
- La décision d'acceptation finale dépendra de l'inscription au Symposium d'au moins un des auteurs.

Call for papers

All proposals must be received by **May 30th 2013**.

- The abstract, including the authors' names, affiliations, email, and administrative address, and title should not exceed 250 words. Please ensure that the title of your presentation reflects the content of the material to be presented and does not exceed 15 words.

As the abstract will be published in the *Journal of Veterinary Behavior: Clinical Application and Research*, please see the following guidelines.

- All abstract submissions will be reviewed by the Scientific Committee and the presenting author will be notified that the abstract has been either accepted or rejected by **June 15th 2013**.
- Although an author can submit several abstracts, each presenting author may present only one talk, or one poster (but not both a talk and a poster). Please precise your preference.
- Authors must consider the implications of their work for animal ethics. The Scientific Committee may require additional information if necessary.
- Abstracts of all accepted contributions will be available in a proceeding book.
- Final acceptance depends upon registration of at least one of the contributing authors.

Abstract length: around 250 words to avoid any concerns about ‘pre-publication’ Used American English spelling

Use Times New Roman 11 font.

TITLE –BOLDED, CAPITALIZED (SHOULD BE LEFT JUSTIFIED AND THE SAME SIZE FONT AS THE REST OF THE ABSTRACT)

List of authors- italicized, using numbers as subscripts and an ‘’ to denote corresponding author*

‘Affiliations and addresses for all authors – italicized, match subscripts after names to affiliations(please note: addresses should at least include city, state, county, canton, province, et cetera, and country but you can provide a longer address if you wish)

** Corresponding author: italicized, author’s email address (please note: if you wish you can also include phone/fax #s here but it is not mandatory)*

Body of abstract – skip one line after corresponding author’s email address and then enter text without headers for introduction, conclusion etc.

Use the same font style and size used in the title and author/affiliation information above without the italics.

The last line of the abstract text is immediately followed by the key words, i.e., no line space.

Key words: Bolded, 2 words followed by colon; then provide 3-5 key words with each word or phrase separated by a semicolon. The key words themselves are not bolded.

References

It is the author’s choice whether to include references. If references were cited in the text of the abstract, use the author, year of publication style. Then after the key words, skip a line and add “Reference(s)” in bolded letters. Go to the next line to list references. They should be listed alphabetically in the following format:\ Last name, FI. MI., Last name, FI.MI., Year. Title. Journal name in the accepted abbreviation Vol, page numbers.

KITTEN BEHAVIORS AS PREDICTORS OF ADULT FELINE TEMPERAMENT: THE NEED FOR A BETTER MOUSETRAP

Adult personalities that differ from owner expectations may be a significant reason for owner dissatisfaction with their feline pets. When adopted as kittens, cats may display behaviors that endear them to their new owners but these may change as cats reach social maturity. A test that is able to predict adult feline temperament when administered at an earlier age may help to match cats to prospective owners and decrease the number of adult cats relinquished to shelters due to a mismatch in personalities. Three hundred and seventy-two kittens were tested at a local shelter during a 14 month period. The test evaluated the kittens' responses to 16 scenarios that included physical contact from humans, introduction to unfamiliar adult and juvenile felines and canines, exposure to novel environments, sounds, canine and feline vocalizations and a variety of toys. Kittens were tested between the ages of 10-16 weeks of age and scored on a 5 point subjective scale. The kittens were followed after adoption for 18 months; 327 kittens completed the study. Owners were contacted via telephone 2, 4, 6, 12 and 18 months after adoption and a 13 point questionnaire was administered. The behaviors of interest included aggression, playfulness, assertiveness/confidence, sociability and elimination habits. The owners also were asked about their overall satisfaction with their cats as pets. The test instrument was unable to reliably predict adult feline behavior although the majority of owners reported overall satisfaction with their relationship with their adult cats, even when it did not match with the owners' original expectations at the time of adoption.
